Managing Money

Managing money on this trip will be a little different than band trips of the past. Please see the notes below.

Cash

Cash is still accepted in the parks, but in a limited way. Not all counters take cash. Currently, some restaurants are card only. Setting aside a certain amount of cash each day is still a great way to budget. But it is important to be careful with your cash - make it last and keep it safe and secure.

Part of our band travel is promoting appreciation for all service people we come in contact with on our trips. We **strongly** encourage each student to show their appreciation for the following service professionals by setting aside cash gratuities:

STA Guide - Our guide will spend the first day making sure our hotel rooms are ready when returning from our long day. They will keep our buses on time, coordinate security at night, and assist with transportation to and from each park. <u>Standard gratuity is \$1 per person per day, totaling \$5.</u>

Hotel Maid Service - These wonderful people have our rooms ready for us each day. They provide fresh sheets, towels, cleaning supplies and remove waste. They make our rooms comfortable. <u>Standard gratuity</u> is \$1 per night per person totaling \$4.

Dining - It is customary to tip wait staff when we dine in a "sit-down" restaurant. Gratuities vary.

We have been told that cash can be converted into gift cards. If you prefer to carry a park gift card instead of cash, please see a retail store at the parks.

Gift Cards

Cards are the preferred payment option in the parks. Students will be given cards daily for food. However, the cards can also be used for retail purchases. Students are required to eat every meal, and therefore must use these cards for food before using them for souvenirs.

Take a photo of your card information each day. If your card is lost at Disney, we've been told it can be replaced by calling the number on the card and providing the card numbers.

Room keys will also be on cards that look similar to the food gift cards. Students should take care and not confuse these.

Checklist

Should be used for packing, and double-checked before leaving home.

- Requirement: sign up for BT2.0 Remind: text @nyc-201to 81010 or type rmd.at/nyc-201 in your browser
- Clothing to match the weather forecast, INCLUDING BT2.0 SHIRT
- Light jacket, ponchos, or umbrella
- Comfortable shoes
- Medications prepared for Nurse
- Full outfits for everyday we will not wear pajamas outside of the hotel room
- Extra glasses and contacts
- For Southwest Departure: May take carry-on bag or ONE checked bag (free on Southwest).

<u>Checked Bag</u> - Maximum weight is 50 pounds and maximum size is 62 inches (length + width + height) per check piece of luggage. Overweight items from 51 to 100 pounds and oversized items in excess of 62 inches but not more than 80 inches will be accepted for an overweight and oversize baggage fee of \$75 per item. Travel Ban: Lithium batteries that are damaged, defective, or recalled for safety reasons are not allowed in checked baggage, carry-on baggage, or cargo.

<u>Carry-on Bag</u> - Limited in size to 10 x 16 x 24 inches. Carry-on must meet 3-1-1 rule: Each passenger may carry liquids, gels and aerosols in travel-size containers that are 3.4 ounces or 100 milliliters. Passengers are limited to one quart-size bag of liquids, gels and aerosols. Common travel items that must comply with the <u>3-1-1 liquids rule</u> include toothpaste, shampoo, conditioner, mouthwash and lotion. Larger liquid items must be packed in checked baggage.

For American Return: May take carry-on bag or ONE checked bag (\$30 on American, could increase June 1).
<u>Checked Bag</u> - Maximum weight is 50 pounds and maximum size is 62 inches (length + width + height) per check piece of luggage. See travel ban items above.

Carry-on Bag - Limited in size to 9 x 14 x 22 inches. Carry-on must meet 3-1-1 rule (see above).

- All luggage with name and address clearly marked by STA tag (tags given at the airport)
- If eighteen (18+) or over, you must have a government issued ID
- Under eighteen (17 and under) no ID necessary
- Spending money (see budget)
- Cell phone and charger and portable battery
- Extra room (and available weight) for any souvenirs you purchase
- Your STA backpack or other small bag (some places may prohibit large bags)
- Have everything you need for Day 1 on you. You will not have access to your hotel room until after we return from Universal Studios.

'DO NOT' CHECKLIST

*As you check your luggage, be sure the following are NOT included:

- Weapons (guns/knifes/etc.)
- Flip flops, sandals or shoes without backs

COVID Safety Guidelines

Safety guidelines are updated continuously, therefore are subject to change.

School Tours of America

STA guidelines were covered in the trip announcement. Details can be found here.

All participants signed the following Safety Agreement:

I understand that while School Tours of America has undertaken reasonable steps to lessen the risk of transmission of COVID-19 during travel, School Tours of America is not responsible for risks related to COVID-19 in relation to student travel. I understand the risks associated with participating in a tour at this time. I acknowledge that my traveler has not been in contact with anyone who has been exposed to COVID-19 within the past 14 days. I also acknowledge that my traveler has not experienced any common symptoms of COVID-19, such as fever, chills, cough, shortness of breath or sore throat the past 14 days. I agree not to allow my child to travel if they are showing symptoms and will abide by COVID-19 Travel Guidelines and Restrictions.

From Band Staff:

It is important that all travelers avoid crowds and gatherings leading up to the trip. If anyone exhibits COVID-19 symptoms, they will not be able to travel.

Southwest Airlines

Federal law requires each person to wear a mask at all times in the airport and throughout the flight, including during boarding and deplaning. Refusing to wear a mask is a violation of federal law and may result in denial of boarding, removal from the aircraft, and/or penalties under federal law. A properly worn mask completely covers the nose and mouth, is secured to the head, and fits snugly against the side of the face.

American Airlines

U.S. federal law requires that you wear a face covering from the time you enter the airport where your trip begins, on board your flight, and until you leave the airport where your trip ends. If you refuse to wear one, you may be denied boarding and future travel on American. You may also face penalties under federal law.

These rules do not apply to children under 2, or if you have a disability that prevents you from wearing a face covering and meet the exemption requirements.

You should bring your own face covering to use while traveling. While limited quantities of face coverings may be available at the gate, they will not be available for every customer on every flight.

Acceptable face coverings

- A mask or 2 layered secured cloth that completely covers your nose and mouth and fits snugly to the sides of your face and under your chin
- Face shields worn with a face covering, but not in place of one

These are not acceptable as face coverings

- Balaclavas
- Bandanas
- Face covers with exhaust valves or vents
- Face covers made of mesh or lace type fabric
- Gaiters
- Scarves
- Ski masks

During your flight

- Your face covering must be worn and visible at all times, including if you plan to sleep.
- You can briefly lower or remove your face covering while actively eating, drinking or taking oral medication, but it must be worn between bites and sips.
- If oxygen masks drop from an overhead compartment, remove your face covering before placing the oxygen mask over your nose and mouth.

Buses, Transportation and Other Public Areas

It is likely that masks will be required in all public areas. All travelers must follow the rules established and/or posted for all public areas and all modes of transportation that we will use throughout the trip.

Universal Studios and Islands of Adventure

What new operational procedures are in place in the Theme Parks?

- Guests and team members are required to wear face coverings in all indoor locations and at all attractions.
- Limiting and reducing daily park attendance and attraction ridership in Universal Studios and Islands of Adventure
- Increasing cleaning and disinfection of food locations, ride vehicles and other frequent "touch points" that go beyond our already-aggressive cleaning procedures
- Social distancing at all locations through the parks, to include attractions, shows, restaurants and merchandise locations
- Having Virtual LineTM experiences available for select attractions
- Offering contactless payments and "no touch" policies where possible
- Wash your hands with soap and water often for at least 20 seconds.
- When present, please stand on the floor markings until the group in front of you moves forward.
- At select locations including prior to boarding ride vehicles, guests will be required to use hand sanitizer.
- Practice social distancing and keep at least 6 feet (2 meters) between your travel party and others.
- Please follow directions from our team members and have patience as we work through these new operational procedures.

Mask Rules - Required

- Must cover your nose and mouth and be secured under your chin
- Must fit snugly against the sides of your face and be secured with ear loops or secured around your head

Mask Rules - Not Permitted

- Face coverings with exhalation valves
- Face coverings that include mesh material or holes of any kind
- Face coverings that are unable to be secured under your chin, such as bandannas
- Face coverings that are not secured with ear loops or secured around your head
- · Costume masks or veils, per our costume guideline

Disney World Parks

By visiting Walt Disney World Resort you voluntarily assume all risks related to exposure to COVID-19.

Face Coverings

Face coverings are required for all Guests (ages 2 and up) and Cast Members, including those who have received a COVID-19 vaccine. Guests are required to wear face coverings in all **indoor** locations, except when actively eating or drinking while stationary and maintaining appropriate physical distancing. Please bring your own face coverings and wear them at all times, except when dining or swimming. You may temporarily remove your face covering while actively eating, drinking or taking an outdoor photo, but you must be stationary and maintain appropriate physical distancing during this time.

- All face coverings (whether disposable or reusable) must:
- Be made with at least 2 layers of breathable material
- Fully cover the nose and mouth and secure under the chin
- Fit snugly but comfortably against the side of the face
- Be secured with ties or ear loops and allow the Guest to remain hands-free

At this time, based on guidance from health authorities, neck gaiters, open-chin triangle bandanas and face coverings containing valves, mesh material or holes of any kind are not acceptable face coverings.

Costume masks are also not considered appropriate and are prohibited from being worn, in alignment with our existing rules. Face coverings may have an integrated transparent plastic panel to aid in viewing the wearer's mouth. These face coverings must:

- Be a fabric face covering featuring a solid plastic panel containing no openings that is attached to the fabric on all sides using tight knit stitching
- Meet all face covering requirements listed above
- The use of face coverings is not a substitute for physical distancing.

What to do if you feel ill or have a medical emergency?

-If you feel ill you should call our nurse, Jordan Farley, at <u>682.999.6788</u>. Do not use the park nurse station for minor concerns. -If you have a medical emergency, use the parks nurse/medical station, and contact Jordan Farley or Mr. Nutt.

Important Notices for Students

- **Drugs, alcohol, tobacco, vaporizers, and weapon notice:** If you are found with any of these substances or items in your possession, then you will be sent back to Crandall on the first available flight. Your parents will be charged for the cost of airfare. Discipline may be required upon your return.
- **Room checks:** They will happen every night. Everyone assigned to your room must be present and in sight. You will not leave your room (unless you need a security guard) after lights-out or as instructed by a director.
- Cell phones: Please keep your phone with you and charged. Directors will have a phone list.
- Money: You are responsible for keeping up with your own money. Keep it in something that is not easily grabbed or taken. Never leave money, credit cards, jewelry, or other important belongings laying anywhere. Keep money in smaller bills (\$20 or less). Do not wave around money in public.
- Meals: Students are required to eat at every meal.
- Gratuity: Please keep dollar bills for gratuity for your tour guides, restaurant wait staff, and hotel service people.
- **Medicine:** Students are not permitted to keep any prescription or non-prescription medications with them during the trip. The only exceptions to this is during the flight, and if you have permission to carry/administer on file with the school district (particularly for inhalers and EpiPens). Anyone bringing medication must file the medication form prior to the trip.
- Emergency: If you need a band director while separated from the large or small groups, call Mr. Nutt at 214.538.2741.

General Guidelines

- Should any problems arise on the trip, the band directors will handle them. Students will be respectful of all chaperones.
- You are responsible for all of your own luggage. Never leave anything unattended.
- No public or private displays of affection. Refer to the CISD Guidelines.
- Be on time and have what you need for that particular day. Always double check.
- Dress appropriately. Wear comfortable shoes. Bring rain gear if necessary. Layers are important during long days with temperature changes.
- Act mature and use good judgment in all public places. You are representing Crandall High School at all times.
- Theft or vandalism is totally unacceptable and will be dealt with as a major school offense.
- Do not get into any vehicle other than the authorized vehicles we take as a group.
- We enter vehicles together, we exit vehicles together. It happens fast, pay attention.
- You must stay within the boundaries set by the directors at each destination. <u>Always</u> be in groups of 4 to 5.
- Students will not wear headphones or earbuds of any kind while out each day. This is a safety issue and non-negotiable. Save them for the plane.
- Students should be engaged and attentive at all times. Disconnect from your device (except when necessary), and enjoy your trip.

Primary Responsibilities for Chaperones

- Help students remember that they represent our school and community always.
- Watch carefully for potential problems, and notify a director if necessary.
- Make sure our students stay together when using transportation.
- Please encourage students to clean up after themselves.
- Help students be on time.

Hotel Guidelines

- No one is allowed in another person's room. This means being through the threshold of the door. There are no exceptions to this rule.
- Only current Crandall HS band students, directors, or chaperones can be in the hotel room.
- Curfew violations are among the most serious issues on trips for security reasons. We will clearly establish when you are to be in your rooms and when you may come out the next morning. Security will be checking on you throughout the night.
- Please keep noise level down, especially in rooms. Other guests are staying at the hotel.
- The rooms will be checked for damage upon arrival and upon leaving. Horseplay (wrestling) should be avoided in order to not have "accidents." Report any damage immediately to a band director.
- Keep doors locked. When someone knocks always check through the peephole first.
- Deliveries (including food deliveries) are not allowed for students.
- The hotel will not be responsible for valuables left in the room.
- Even though there is cleaning service every day, keep room clean by throwing things away and picking up after yourself. The hotel may bill individuals in the room for stains, spills, or damage.
- We cannot make room changes.
- If you need something from the front desk, ask a chaperone or director to get it for you.
