Things to bring:

This is always a simple list to make because you don't need a lot for band camp. Dress is always comfortable and casual. You will need tennis shoes to march in and you must have closed toed shoes on after dinner. You will want to pack a swimsuit and bring a towel. The beds are bunk style. You can use single sheets with or without a sleeping bag and don't forget to bring a pillow. Basic toiletries are needed as well as bug spray and sunscreen.

Things not to bring:

There is no way to cover all the things you don't bring to camp but understand that this is a school trip and anything that is banned at school is also banned at camp. You are subject to search and dogs have been utilized in the past so please do not bring anything that would keep you from going or send you home early from camp.

Required Paperwork:

- Permission slip signed by your parents. (Both pages or front and back depends on how you print the form) Forms are on the band website
- UIL Physical on file for you with athletics. District policy is every student must do a physical every year. YOU CANNOT GO TO CAMP WITHOUT A PHYSICAL ON FILE. Final payment is due at registration.
- You should have already paid the \$50 deposit (If not that is due immediately) you will
 owe \$250 before we leave for camp. These payments can be done online from the link
 on the band website.

Behavior:

You are expected to uphold the standards of what it means to be in our band. If any of the following behaviors are witnessed there will be consequences that can include sending you home from camp and ending your band career.

Hazing - Any form of picking on someone for any reason is not acceptable.

Cursing - Your word selection will be positive and intelligent.

PPDA - The will be no public or private displays of affection. (Hence the extra "P")

Attendance - You are expected to be at every event at camp

Boundaries- The boundaries of the camp will be well defined for you, and you will be expected to stay in that area throughout the week.

Visitors:

There will be no outside visitors to the camp until 8:00 am Friday morning when we open the camp for our competition and concert by the lake at 9:00. We will have two police officers on duty during the week and they will be instructed to stop any incoming vehicle. Therefore, if your parents must bring you something at camp be sure to notify a director. We will arrange things with the officer on duty. Please spread the word to any former students that there will be no visits during the week of camp and anyone trying to come into the camp without authorization will be turned away.

Health:

Sandy Sagredo will be our camp nurse this year. She will be in charge of distributing all medications. You will check those in with us before we leave for camp. You will be given a water bottle at camp and the coolers will stay full in the center of the grounds by the cafeteria. Drink lots and lots of water and use sunscreen by day and bug screen by night. Meals are required so do not plan on skipping any of them. The camp food is really good with a nice variety of items. If you have special dietary needs now is the time to email Mr. Nutt so he can notify the camp.

Friday's Camp Activities will start at 9:00 AM with the goal being that everyone leaves the camp at 11:00 AM.

Please consider this as we plan this year's camp and follow the rules. We utilize this time to build relationships and learn the fundamentals of marching band.
